Principal's News

SAFETY Unfortunately even though our students are largely being caring and polite students at school we have had some concerning behaviours on their way to and from school which have been dangerous. After talking to the students we think some of these are misunderstandings particularly around the crossing on South Seas Drive. Can you please reinforce the information we have given the students.

- A. Don't stand too close to the edge of South Seas Drive until you are sure no cars are in sight.
- B. Go straight across to the middle island (don't stop and go back).
- C. Repeat the procedure from the island before crossing the next section.
- D. If in doubt don't walk out. Do not start, stop and start again as this can make it very difficult for cars to know what you are doing.

Although this is a 40km zone you can't assume that all cars are doing this speed. Cars should not stop at this crossing so please wait for them to pass. Big students please help our younger students keep safe.

PARENT SURVEY

Thank you to those families who replied (10%). Unfortunately compared to our paper surveys the percentages of replies was quite low this year. However we still remain committed to using them to plan for the next three years.

For communication the majority (37.5%) prefer text messages if technological communication is used.			

There were 52 individual respondents who added comments to our survey. Most points were only mentioned by one respondent and these will be looked at on a case by case basis. Some of the suggestions have been tried before and others are new and worth considering. Those that had multiple respondents will be addressed in both day to day planning and where appropriate through the strategic plan.

The feeling of a lack of welcome by staff and in particular the principal is of concern even if it is only a few people. While we are all very busy and do ask that you make an appointment for specific purposes we do try to make the time for every parent or carer who makes a request. I also certainly personally take on board that I could be more visible and welcoming but please if you feel that I can participate with you or interact with your child more, let me know. We are always open to suggestions. However, things such as knowing what class a child is in on the first day is rarely possible as we cannot be 100% sure which children are returning or enrolling. In fact in the past we have had to change classes for a few children the following day. We do not like doing this and hopefully most changes occur during the first day so students can go home excited to tell their parents about their new classes.

The issues that three respondents mentioned are:

Take no out of zone enrolments.

More classes for gifted and talented students.

More fundraising for smartboards, permanent buildings and updated facilities such as the hall.

Class teachers having less time away from class.

No support to attend activities if you can't afford them.

Need more time on literacy and numeracy.

More focus on technology.

More times for parent/teacher meetings and regular student progress communication with parents.

There were also many positive comments. The following were mentioned more than three times:

Teachers are fantastic/enthusiastic/hardworking.

Small group work is fantastic.

Communication from school is easy, especially SMS.

Overall atmosphere is positive.

Like that students are learning to mingle with other grades.

Students are well disciplined and safe.

Staff go above and beyond, staff deserve so much recognition from the parents for all the extra things they do.

Teachers keep us up to date with children's progress.

Great school band, choir and extra activities.

My child loves school.

Staff are prompt to reply to concerns.

We enjoy attending all the activities – fair, picnic lunches, carnivals, fun days, concerts.

Ashtonfield is a credit to the whole staff and the way the team works together.

Very comfortable approaching the principal or teachers to discuss my child.

We are very happy with Ashtonfield school.

We thank you all for your contributions, they are very much valued and will be used to help us further improve our school. We will work with the P&C also to do this.

STUDENT SURVEY

Years 4 to 6 completed this on-line with the following results. These results will also be considered in our planning process (except perhaps the repeated request for a pool which is beyond our budget).

The most notable difference between the parents and the students is the type of homework that is preferred.

82%	students have a high sense of belonging
86%	of students have positive relationships
40%	of students valued school outcomes.
65%	of students said they had positive attitude to homework
88%	believe they don't ever get into trouble
67%	said they were interested in school
84%	said they tried hard to succeed
50%	felt highly challenged and 27% more still felt confident
15%	were not confident in either English or Maths
21%	of students felt anxious
79%	students rated effective teaching time
78%	students rated relevance
78%	felt that classrooms were well organised, there was a clear purpose with immediate and appropriate feedback
78%	always felt safe attending school
75%	felt they have very positive teacher-student relations
72%	felt rules and expectations were clear and a high standard
83%	felt teacher had high expectations that they would achieve
60%	felt they had someone at home or in the community who provided encouragement
64%	preferred projects for homework and another 10% at least wanted some projects
86%	said they were able to use technology for homework

There were a further 485 comments which were largely positive with comments such as "enjoy my friends, my favourite subjects, I learn a lot". A pool was the most common request.
